SACRAMENTS

Sacrament of Baptism- The sacrament of Baptism will be celebrated on Sundays after 11:00 a.m. Mass. Please call the Parish Office at least two months in advance in order to make arrangements. Parents must be registered in the parish and active for at least three months prior to the Baptism.

Sponsors must be canonically eligible.

Certificates of Eligibility- sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation requires that a person be an active, registered member of the parish three months prior to receiving the certificate of eligibility. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage- Please call the Parish Office at least 6 months before the proposed marriage dates in order to arrange for the necessary preparation. An appointment is necessary before a wedding date may be scheduled. Parish and Diocesan pre-marital classes are required. Only parish guidelines will be followed in planning the marriage ceremony.

Order of Christian Funerals- At the time of death, contact the funeral home of your choice.

The funeral home will then contact the Parish Office.

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

February 22, 2026

This Sunday marks the beginning of the liturgical season of Lent, with liturgical color being purple/violet. This sacred season prepares Catholics and other Christians for the celebration of Easter through prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and repentance. Lent is one of the most important seasons of the liturgical year, inviting believers to slow down, turn away from sin, and renew their relationship with God as they journey toward the Resurrection.





GUIDE TO **FASTING**



FRIDAYS OF LENT:

March 7, March 14, March 21, March 28, April 4, April 11,
Good Friday April 18

RULES FOR FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine are required to fast and abstain from meat (fish is permitted) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Catholics over fourteen should abstain on all Fridays in Lent.



The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing—as far as quantity and quality are concerned—approved local custom.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we should not only abstain from all meat, but also fast by limiting ourselves to one meal for the entire day.

TIPS FOR FASTING

Start Slow: If you're new to fasting, begin with small steps like skipping one meal.

Stay Hydrated: Drink plenty of water throughout the fasting period to stay healthy.

Choose Wisely: Opt for nutritious foods when breaking your fast to nourish your body.

Pray and Reflect: Use fasting as a time for prayer, self-examination, and drawing closer to God.

BENEFITS OF FASTING

Spiritual Growth: Fasting can deepen our spiritual connection and focus during Lent.

Self-Discipline: The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that fasting "helps us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart" (2043). Fasting teaches self-control and strengthens our willpower.


Solidarity: Fasting in solidarity with others fosters empathy and compassion.

EXCEPTIONS TO FASTING

Those with health conditions, pregnant or nursing women, and the elderly are exempt from fasting requirements.

If fasting poses a risk to your health or well-being, you are not obligated to fast.
